

IPR Protection Scheme for Facilitating Start-Ups & Exemptions

SIPP is envisioned as protecting and promoting intellectual property rights of start-ups and to encourage innovation and creativity amongst them. In January 2016, Department of Industrial Policy and promotion of the Government of India launched the "Scheme for Facilitating Start-Ups Intellectual Property Protection (SIPP) to promote awareness and encourage IPR protection amongst start-ups. The scheme shall run initially on a pilot basis and shall be applicable for a period of one year from the date of launch of start-up India. It aims to promote awareness and adoption of intellectual property rights amongst start-ups. The scheme is inclined to nurture and mentor innovative and emerging technologies among start-ups and assist them in protecting and commercializing it by providing them access to high-quality IP services and resources. According to the notification, an entity shall be considered as a 'start-up':

- Up to five years from the date of its incorporation/registration;
- If its turnover for any of the financial years has not exceeded Rs. 25 crore; and
- It is working towards innovation, development, deployment or commercialization of new products, processes or services driven by technology or intellectual property.
